THE ADVENTURE RACES

Adventure racing, overseen in France by the French Triathlon Federation and by other federations around the world, is among the most demanding endurance disciplines. Halfway between an expedition and a competition, it combines physical exertion, navigation and teamwork in exceptional natural setting.

Its goal : to showcase the beauty of untouched landscapes through off the beaten path itineraries



Its concept : 4 team members - both men and women – in full autonomy, a 4 to 8 day immersion, where teamwork matters just as much as performance

ARWS : THE WORLD ADVENTURE RACING CIRCUIT

The Adventure Racing World Series is the global circuit for adventure races.

It brings together more than 80 long-format races around the world, along with shorter continental events.

It produces a worldwide ranking used to select the teams for the annual world championship: the Adventure Racing World Championship (ARWC).

In 2026, this world championship will be hosted by France, on the island of Corsica.

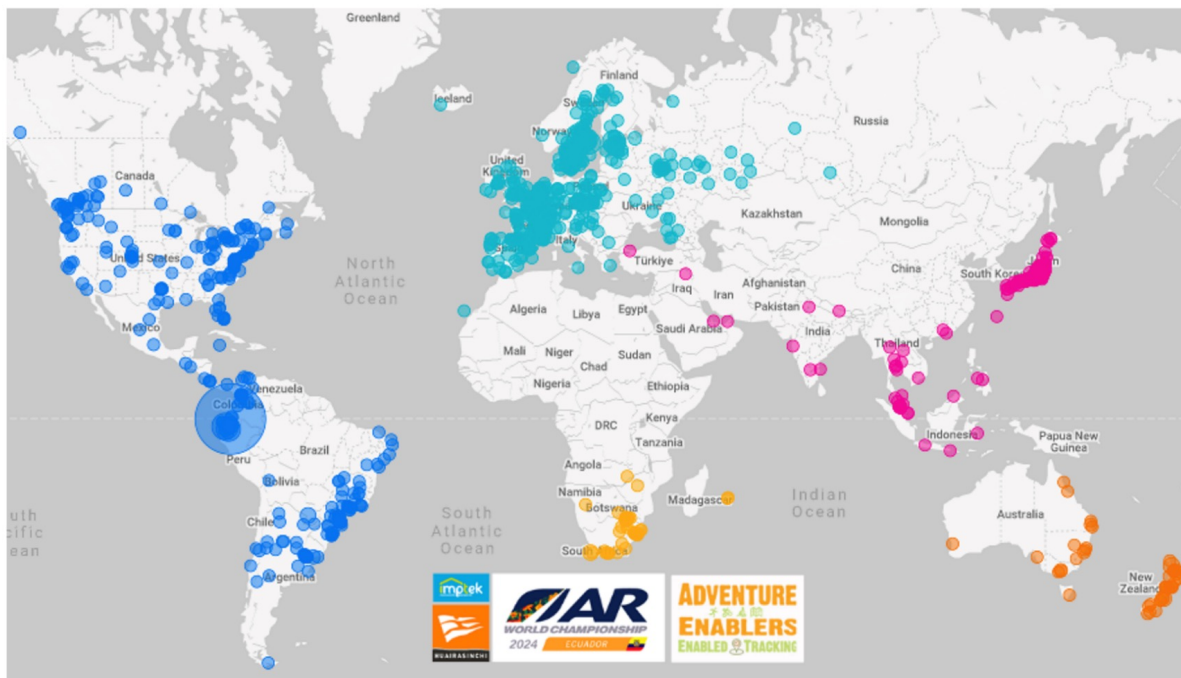

PASCAL BAHUAUD'S INTERVIEW



Pascal Bahuaud, race director and founder of the French leg of the ARWS adventure races.

What is the spirit of adventure racing??

Races of the Adventure Racing World Series circuit are created to encourage a maximum autonomy of the competitors. GPS devices are prohibited and replaced by maps at a 1:50,000 scale instead. Competitors will go through such magnificent landscapes that they will naturally adopt a preservation mindset. Raising awareness and fostering responsibility proves far more effective than strict access bans, in his sense, we believe that a careful and thoughtful use of natural spaces is far more efficient. This constant reflection on nature serves the design of the race as a genuine driving force.

Why is Corsica an exceptional set up for this World Championship?

We are preparing an authentic race that encourages a respectful exploration of the island's natural territories. Our baseline, Back to Nature, reflects our desire for this immersive team expedition to stay true to the essence of non-stop adventure racing.

What could be more “magical” than the Island of Beauty to host this World Championship? We are proud to prepare such a challenge and excited for the months ahead, fully dedicated to bringing this extraordinary adventure to life.

A PROMISE: BACK TO NATURE



- Né à Corte, au cœur de la montagne corse, j'ai grandi au bord du Tavignanu et de la Restonica, dont les eaux cristallines ont éveillé ma vocation d'hydrobiologiste. Après une longue carrière de professeur d'écologie consacrée à l'étude et à la protection des écosystèmes aquatiques de l'île, je livre ici ma vision de la Corse : un territoire vivant, fragile et exceptionnel, dont chacun de nous est le gardien.
- La Corse et ses multiples atouts constituent pour ses habitants un cadre de vie d'exception et une destination touristique unique. Avec ses 320 sommets à plus de 2 000 mètres d'altitude, ses massifs forestiers, ses cours d'eau et ses lacs de montagne, l'île de Beauté présente un patrimoine naturel exceptionnel. Sans oublier les 1 000 km de littoral blanc et des eaux turquoise parmi les plus pures de Méditerranée. Et son GR20, considéré comme l'un des sentiers de grande randonnée les plus beaux et les plus exigeants d'Europe. Cette île recèle une biodiversité remarquable avec une flore et une faune riches en espèces endémiques.
- Ce territoire insulaire présente un patrimoine bâti unique avec de nombreux monuments historiques classés ou inscrits : citadelles, châteaux et sites fortifiés médiévaux, tours génoises, cathédrales et oratoires. Les ponts génois enjambant nos belles rivières me sont particulièrement chers car ils témoignent d'une civilisation qui a su composer avec la montagne et l'eau depuis des siècles.
- L'île de Beauté c'est aussi un patrimoine culturel matériel et immatériel où la langue corse, langue romane à part entière, vivante et revendiquée, est intimement liée à l'identité insulaire. Les polyphonies corses, ces chants traditionnels (paghjella) inscrits au patrimoine culturel immatériel de l'Unesco, sont une musique vocale d'une puissance émotionnelle rare. Ces chants sont un des piliers des nombreuses manifestations populaires ancrées dans le territoire. La Corse renferme également de nombreux sites mégalithiques, les plus remarquables de Méditerranée.
- La Corse ce sont aussi ses « savoir-faire liés à l'artisanat traditionnel » transmis de génération en génération : couteaux corses (vendetta), vannerie, poterie, travail de la pierre et du bois, instruments de musique, parfumerie et huiles essentielles. Ainsi que son patrimoine culinaire qui valorise les savoir-faire traditionnels et les produits emblématiques d'un territoire (charcuterie, fromages, farine de châtaigne, huile d'olive, vins, miels, clémentines de Corse), véritables témoins de l'identité culturelle et gastronomique insulaire, et pour moi, enfant de Corte, une évidence incarnée dans les beignets au brocciu de ma grand-mère, elle est partie, mais l'odeur de ses beignets, elle, ne s'en va pas.

- L'histoire de la Corse a été marquée par deux hommes nés de l'île : Pascal Paoli (1725 - 1807) et Napoléon Bonaparte (1769 - 1821). Paoli, chef politique et militaire corse, mena la lutte pour l'indépendance de la Corse. Il fonda un État corse moderne avec une constitution (la première constitution démocratique moderne en 1795) et une université à Corte, ma ville natale, où j'ai enseigné l'Écologie durant 40 ans. Paoli mis en place une administration organisée, ce qui lui valut le surnom de « père de la patrie corse ».
- Bonaparte, figure historique mondiale, militaire et homme d'État, il devint empereur des Français en 1804 après la Révolution française. Grand stratège, il conquiert une grande partie de l'Europe. Bonaparte réforma durablement la France avec le Code civil, le Code de commerce et le Code pénal. Mais aussi la création des préfets et la réorganisation des communes et des départements. Il créa le baccalauréat, la Banque de France, la Légion d'honneur... Ces institutions font encore partie du quotidien français.

- La Corse n'est pas seulement une île à admirer, c'est un écosystème vivant à comprendre, à écouter et à protéger. C'est en transmettant intact cet héritage commun aux générations futures que nous honorons le mieux notre appartenance à cette terre.

Our baseline, **Back to nature**, is an ode to respect for nature and reflects each participant's commitment to preserving it.

Before the start, runners, volunteers and partners sign the **Back to nature charter**, demonstrating the deep-rooted commitment to organizing the event with respect for natural spaces.

The **Back to nature charter for ARWC 2026** was written by **Antoine Orsini**, president of the Organizing Committee.



Antoine Orsini has held elected office for more than forty years in Corsica. Professor of hydrobiology at the University of Corsica, he is also a recognized ecologist, long committed to the study and preservation of the island's natural environments.

Thanks to the commitment of one of our long-standing partners, the company Lethiguel, 100 units of Corsi, the mouflon mascot of ARWC 2026, will be offered for sale in support of the association A Casa Anto.

Based in Ajaccio, A Casa Anto supports children with disabilities and their families, using physical activity in particular as a tool for learning, autonomy and inclusion. The 100 charity mascots will be sold at the finish line in L'Île-Rousse, at the Altore stand, alongside the official 'ARWC 2026 – Corsica is Magic' collection, specially created for the World Championship.

The partnership will also take on a symbolic dimension at the end of the race: every runner who crosses the finish line will receive their own Corsi. A companion serving as a souvenir symbol of the values that bring together ARWC 2026, the competitors and A Casa Anto: pushing beyond limits, solidarity, and the power of sport to open up new possibilities.

WORLD'S TOP 2 PORTRAIT



400TEAM ALTORE (FRANCE), N°1

Sébastien Raichon, Sandrine Béranger, Adrien Lhermet, joined by Matthieu Bajard, are the 2024 world champions (Ecuador) and 2025 bronze medalists (Canada).

After fifteen years of heroic quests and twists of fate overcome with a legendary resilience, the French arrive in Corsica at the peak of their powers.

Lead by its extraordinary captain Sébastien Raichon – three time winner of the Tor des Glaciers, first place finisher in the Terminorum and record holder for the GR20 self-supported race - this team, whose members complement each other perfectly, is preparing to take on the Island of Beauty. More than just contenders, they are leaders who have come to write a new chapter in their history.



ESTONIAN ACE LA SPORTIVA (ESTONIA), N°2

Coming from a country without mountains, the Eensaar brothers (Silver and Rain), Timmo Tammemäe and Reeda Tuula-Fjodorov conquered the wild forests and harsh winters to establish themselves permanently at the top of the global racing circuit.

Their strength ? An absolute discretion and a unique ability to accept suffering instead of fighting against it. Tired of hitting a glass ceiling, these hungry challengers are arriving in Corsica with a pack mentality to break the curse and finally claim their first world title.

THREE CORSICAN TEAMS REGISTERED

A LOCAL INVOLVEMENT PLANNED FROM THE START

To ensure the full participation of the host island, three special invitations (wild cards) were awarded to Corsican teams, in partnership with the Corsican Triathlon League and the University of Corsica. This is an unusual approach on a global circuit, reflecting the desire to make this edition a championship deeply rooted in its local community.

Working with the league, a rigorous selection process was implemented. This allowed the league's president, Nicolas Sauveur, to select the eight athletes who will represent Corsica.

THREE TEAMS, ONE SAME PRIDE

Tafuna Matata and I Triatleti Corsi : these two teams from the Corsican League will take on teams from around the world on a land they know better than anyone.

The next generation is also joining the festivities with **Squadra Universita**, a team of students majoring in STAPS (Sciences and Techniques of Physical and Sports Activities) at the University of Corsica. For these young athletes, who are still in training, the experience will extend far beyond the realm of sports: taking part in a world championship alongside seasoned ultra-endurance specialists is a rare opportunity to put their academic training to the test against the reality of a world-class competition.

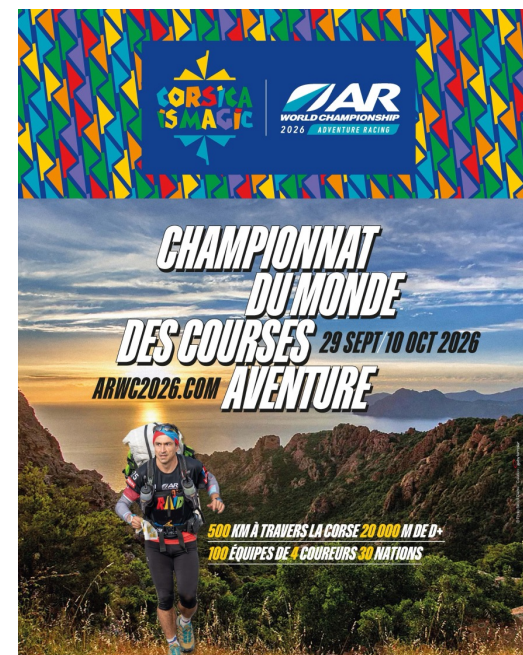

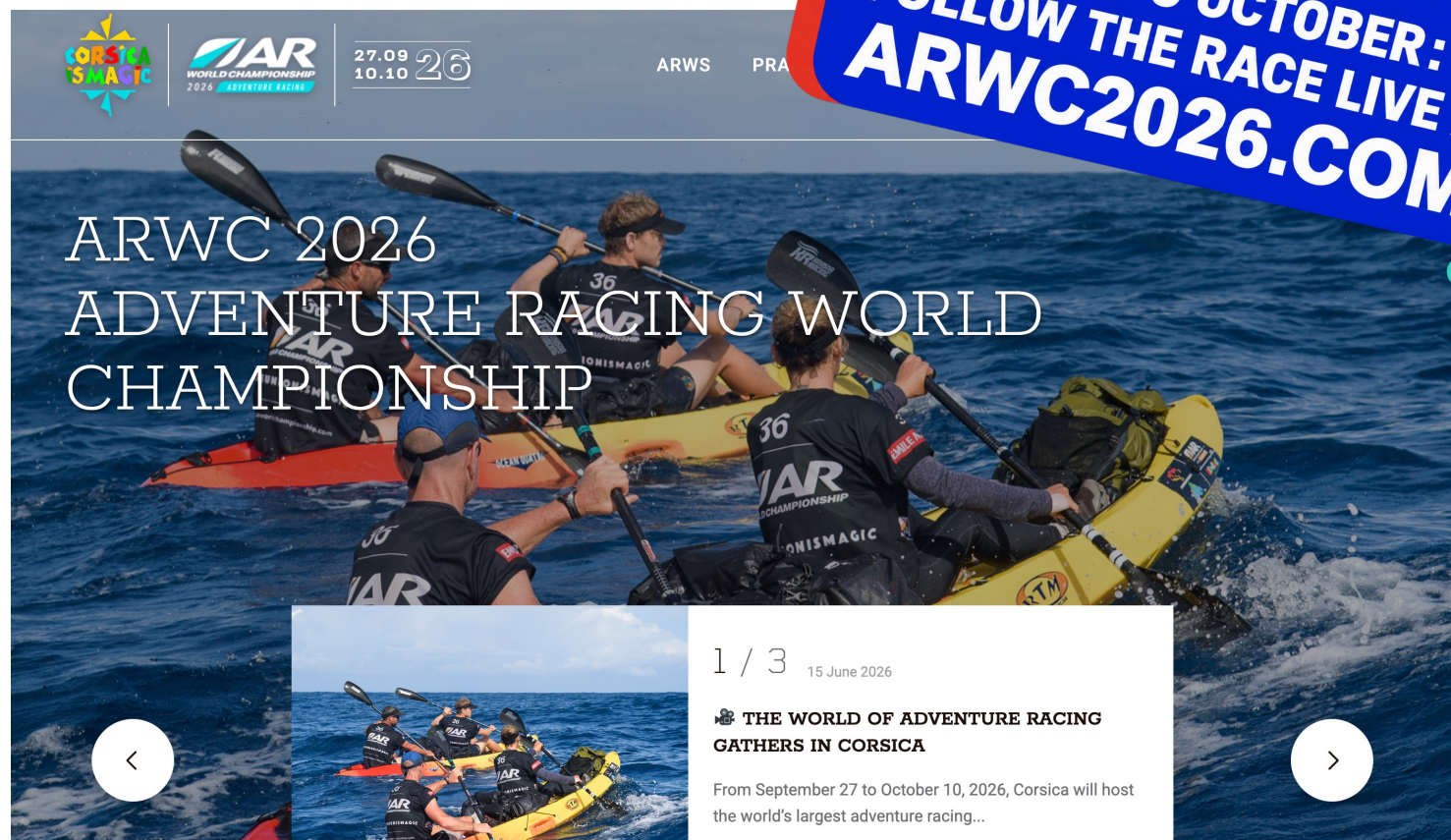
